The meeting was called to order at 10:05 a.m. by Chairman Miller Parnell.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

Minutes of the CAC meetings from September 14, 2022, were approved on a motion by Mr. Ed Kimbrough and seconded by Mr. Darryl League. Motion carried.

Chairman Parnell called for discussion of October 2022 Administrative Modifications and Resolutions. Ms. Messick explained that there was a list of modifications in the agenda packet to review that were discussed during the month of October to keep the members of the CAC up to date. There were four modifications that created changes to the TIP and three modifications that did not create changes to the TIP spreadsheet during these months. Ms. Messick also reported there were no resolutions adopted in October.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

Chairman Parnell called for the Review of FY 20-23 TIP Update and Administrative Modifications. Ms. Messick gave the members a copy of the current TIP. There were no administrative modifications that made changes to the TIP Spreadsheet and four administrative modifications that did not create changes to the spreadsheet.

Chairman Parnell then called for discussion of Resolution No. 840. Ms. Messick explained this resolution is to adopt and support the Statewide Performance Measurement Targets for Safety (PM1), Bridge and Pavement Performance (PM2), and FHWA System Performance (PM3). She explained PM1 targets are updated and adopted annually while PM2 and PM3 targets are updated and adopted bi-annually. A screenshot of the ALDOT safety portal was provided to show the MPO area is currently supporting PM1 targets. A motion was made by Mr. Tim Huddleston to approve this amendment with **Resolution No. 840**, which was seconded by Mr. Darryl League. Motion carried.

Chairman Parnell next called for discussion of Status Report of Pre-Construction projects. Ms. Messick explained the TAC would be reporting on preconstruction projects to keep the MPO updated on how the projects were progressing. The report included project #30 Reconfigure intersection US-78 and Barry is on time for December Let; project #41 bridge replacement on Airport Rd at Coldwater creek is working on environmental and plans and will need an extension from FHWA for PE funding; #48-50 Friendship Rd from Cheaha Dr to Circle Drive all 3 phases will need TS&L and draft hydraulic study; #33 Chief Ladiga Trail had a subliminal man-day submitted and approved. She further reported project #44, Installation of a Roundabout at Bynum Leatherwood Rd and Old Gadsden Highway is on schedule for January 23 Let.

Chairman Parnell next called for discussion of Status Report of ALDOT projects. Ms. Messick reported US-431 access management and I-20 resurfacing from Snow Creek to the Calhoun/Cleburne County line are both working on punch list items and awaiting final acceptance; US-431 resurfacing from 0.28 miles south of SR 204 to the Etowah County line is on contract for shoulder treatment; I-20 resurfacing from H.J. Bentley Jr. Overpass to Snow Creek is awaiting permanent stripe; and Russell Drive resurfacing and traffic stripe will be pushed to spring due to seasonal limitations.

Chairman Parnell continued by calling for discussion of Safety Observations. Ms. Messick explained that there was a list of previous observations in the agenda packet for review. Ms. Messick explained there were a few updates. The first was to item #15, this will be considered with the next LRTP. Item #17 may be addressed during resurfacing in the next coming years. #18 will be revisited with the next LRTP update. #23 the City of Aniston is aware the signal timing loop is not operational and needs to be replaced but will need to coordinate with ALDOT prior to replacing the loop. Further discussion was had regarding item #21 and Ms. Messick agreed to pull crash data from the intersection. An update was requested for item #1 and Ms. Messick stated she would follow up with Mr. Fred Denney.

### **OTHER BUSINESS:**

Chairman Parnell Huddleston called for discussion of CAC vacancies. Anniston has 8 vacancies, Jacksonville has 1, Calhoun County has 1, Oxford has 7, and Weaver has 2 vacancies. In the past month there had been 4 seats filled; one by the City of Anniston, 2 by Calhoun County, and 1 by Hobson City; and 1 new vacancy for the City of Weaver.

Next, Chairman Parnell called for the report on Urban Fixed Route and ADA Handicapped Transit Systems. Ms. Messick reported the ADA Paratransit Ridership for Anniston had 474

(decrease) one-way trips, Jacksonville had 117 (decrease) one-way trips, 43 trips for Weaver (decrease), and Oxford had 65 (decrease) one-way trips. For the Urbanized area 118 (decrease) one-way trips and 114 (same) one-way trips for the Rural area. Fixed-route ridership had a total of 7,483 (decrease) riders for the month of October.

The next CAC meeting was scheduled for Wednesday, January 11 at 10:00 a.m.

There being no further business, a motion was made by Mr. Bruce Britton and seconded by Mr. Darryl League to adjourn. The meeting was adjourned at 11:05 a.m.
