The meeting was called to order at 10:04 a.m. by Chairman Miller Parnell.

OLD BUSINESS:

Minutes of the CAC meetings from March 15, 2023, were approved on a motion by Mr. Tim Huddleston and seconded by Mr. Theo Smart. Motion carried.

Chairman Parnell called for discussion of April 2023 Administrative Modifications and Resolutions. Ms. Messick explained that there was a list of modifications in the agenda packet to review that were discussed during the previous month to keep the members of the CAC up to date. There were four modifications that created changes to the TIP and no modifications that did not create changes to the TIP spreadsheet during these months. Ms. Messick also reported there were four resolutions adopted in April.

NEW BUSINESS:

Chairman Parnell called for the Review of FY 20-23 TIP Update and Administrative Modifications. Ms. Messick gave the members a copy of the current TIP. There were six administrative modifications that made changes to the TIP Spreadsheet and one administrative modifications that did not create changes to the spreadsheet.

Chairman Parnell then called for discussion of Resolution No. 849. Ms. Messick explained this resolution was to self-certify the metropolitan transportation planning process is being carried

out in accordance with all applicable requirements. She further explained that the questionnaire was provided in a second handout and had been reviewed by the local transportation bureau and Title VI bureaus at ALDOT. A motion was made by Mr. Tim Huddleston to approve this certification with **Resolution No. 849**, which was seconded by Mr. David West. Motion carried.

Chairman Parnell then called for discussion of Resolution No. 850. Ms. Messick explained this resolution was to amend the Fiscal Year 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) to delete the 64th Street Bridge Replacement (BIN 6204) from year 2026 and add Old Gadsden Highway Resurfacing from Railroad Ave. to HWY 431 to year 2026 and Bynum Leatherwood Resurfacing from Morrisville Rd. to AL-202 to year 2027. The CAC asked the Bynum Leatherwood resurfacing also include a turn lane to the landfill on Morrisville Rd. A motion was made by Mr. Tim Huddleston to approve this amendment with **Resolution No. 850**, which was seconded by Mr. Julie Borrelli. Motion carried.

Chairman Parnell then called for discussion of Resolution No. 851. Ms. Messick explained this resolution was to support the City of Anniston in their TAP Application for Mike Tucker Park Trailhead Improvements. A motion was made by Mr. Theo Smart to approve this amendment with **Resolution No. 851**, which was seconded by Mr. Bruce Britton. Motion carried.

Chairman Parnel next called for discussion of Status Report of Pre-Construction projects. Ms. Messick explained the TAC would be reporting on preconstruction projects to keep the MPO updated on how the projects were progressing. The report included project 41 is waiting on plans and CE is not approved yet; project 49 is working on TS&L; project 50 awaiting plan submission; and project 57 they are reviewing the cost for a right turn lane onto SR-21 due to access management project on 21 which may add to PE and CN.

Chairman Parnell next called for discussion of Status Report of ALDOT projects. Ms. Messick reported that the I-20 resurfacing from Snow Creek to the Calhoun/Cleburne County line, US-431 resurfacing from 0.28 miles south of SR204 to the Etowah County line, and I-20 resurfacing from H.J. Bentley Jr. Overpass to Snow Creek are all working on punch list work, awaiting final acceptance, and expected to be final by next meeting. Mr. Shane continued with Russell Drive resurfacing and traffic stripe from the junction of Peaceburg Rd to the junction of Alexandria road has begun clearing and grubbing to accommodate widening and will include a pipe replacement; reconfiguration of intersection at US 78 and Barry St including resurfacing, widening, and signals has utility conflicts; and US 431 resurfacing from just north of SR-144 to 0.28 miles south of SR-204 is anticipated to start mid-May to early June.

Chairman Parnell continued by calling for discussion of Safety Observations. Ms. Messick explained that there was a list of previous observations in the agenda packet for review. Ms. Messick explained there were a few updates. For item number 32, Mr. Shane Brown from ALDOT had reported all measures to prevent the issue has been taken including signage that no left lane is prohibited. A few more issues were added from the Committee including the Mudd St/Hwy 78 intersection could use improvements due to truck traffic. Ms. Messick stated she would check to make sure this area was in the MPO area before following up on the issue. Moore Ave between the intersections of 15th and 10th Street were reported as extremely bumpy

and in need of resurfacing. Ms. Messick stated s he would check to ensure this road was on the functional classification map prior to following up.

OTHER BUSINESS:

Chairman Parnell called for discussion of CAC vacancies. Anniston has 9 vacancies, Jacksonville has 1, and Oxford has 8 vacancies. The subcommittee planned on getting together soon to set a date and time to meet before the next scheduled meeting.

Next, Chairman Parnell called for the report on Urban Fixed Route and ADA Handicapped Transit Systems. Ms. Messick reported the ADA Paratransit Ridership for Anniston had 518 (decrease) one-way trips, Jacksonville had 187 (decrease) one-way trips, 15 trips for Weaver (decrease), and Oxford had 47 (decrease) one-way trips. For the Urbanized area 81 (decrease) one-way trips and 65 (decrease) one-way trips for the Rural area. Fixed-route ridership had a total of 7,090 (decrease from previous year and previous month) riders for the month of April.

The next CAC meeting was scheduled for Wednesday, July 19 at 10:00 a.m. Ms. Messick announced she would be at a conference that week and asked the Committee if they would like to postpone the meeting a week or cancel the July meeting. All agreed to postpone a week to the 26^{th} of July.

There being no further business, a motion was made by Mr. Tim Huddleston and seconded by Mr. Bruce Britton to adjourn. The meeting was adjourned at 10:51 a.m.
