The meeting was called to order at 10:03 a.m. by Ms. Libby Messick.

Upon reviewing the minutes of the February 8, 2023, meeting, a motion to approve the minutes was made by Mr. Fred Denney and was seconded by Mr. Rodney McCain.

OLD BUSINESS:

There were no old business items to discuss.

NEW BUSINESS:

Ms. Messick called for review of the FY 20-23 TIP Spreadsheet and Administrative Modifications. She gave the members handouts of the list of MPO projects. Ms. Messick explained that there were three administrative modifications that created changes on the TIP spreadsheet and no administrative modifications that did not create changes to the TIP spreadsheet.

Ms. Messick then called for discussion of Resolution No. 846. Ms. Messick explained this resolution was to amend the Fiscal Year 2023 UPWP once remaining FY 2022 UPWP administrative funds were confirmed by ALDOTs local transportation bureau to create Task 6.3 for an economic development supplemental study. This task would allocate \$47,875 towards the supplemental study which will explore the potential economic value of an extended transit route and current modes of transportation working together as well as exploring the impact from further expanding these transportation modes. The JSU proposal was included in the agenda package for review. A motion was made by Mr. Toby Bennington to approve this amendment with **Resolution No. 846**, which was seconded by Mr. Mark Stephens. Motion carried.

Ms. Messick next called for discussion of Status Report of Pre-Construction projects. Mr. Matt Hawes reported project 48 had submitted the environmental and is in review, 60% plans are in progress and should be submitted in early April; project 49 had a verbal approval on the TS&L and 60% plans are moving forward; project 50 were moving forward with 60% plans and anticipating a mid-April/early

may submittal; and project 57 the PS&E was submitted May 9th. Mr. Rodney McCain reported project number 44 had been let and should receive NTP later this month..

Ms. Messick next called for discussion of Status Report of ALDOT projects. Mr. Shane Brown reported I-20 resurfacing from Snow Creek to the Calhoun/Cleburne County line is working on punch list items and final acceptance is anticipated this month; US-431 resurfacing from 0.28 miles south of SR 204 to the Etowah County line is working on shoulder treatment, RPMs, and punch list work; I-20 resurfacing from H.J. Bentley Jr. Overpass to Snow Creek is working on pavement markers and punch list items; and Russell Drive resurfacing and traffic stripe is awaiting pre-construction conference with a tentative start of late May; reconfiguration of the intersection of Barry St/US-78 is awaiting the pre-construction conference with a tentative start of late May. Mr. Mark Stephens reported that the Henry Rd resurfacing contractor has started work.

Ms. Messick then called for discussion of the FY24-27 TIP project preparation. She proposed moving 5 projects out fiscal years to get rid of a negative balance for year 2025. She included projects currently listed in the LRTP that could easily have their funding updated and added for FY 2027. Any projects not included in the LRTP would need to be included in that plan first before included in the TIP.

Next, Ms. Messick continued by calling for discussion of Safety Observations. She explained that there was a handout in the agenda packet with the list of concerns from the CAC that had been discussed at previous meetings for review. Mr. Branton Cole had provided an update for item number 27 prior to the meeting which included that Alabama Power has a work order to repair the lights at this intersection but no time frame for completion was given. Item 30 was discussed and identified that this issue would need to be handled internally and not with ALDOT as there is no ROW available for widening at these problem areas. No further updates were available.

Next, Ms. Messick called for the Report on Urban Fixed Route and ADA Handicapped Transit Systems. She reported there was no report at this time but should be received prior to the MPO Policy Committee meeting the following week and included in that agenda.

The next TAC meeting will be Wednesday, April 12, at 10:00 a.m.

There being no other business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 10:22 a.m.

 -Will move FYs. Increased by 1% from \$193,538 to \$195,473

Resolution #848

Amend the Fiscal Year 2023 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) to include Fiscal Year 2022 Rollover Funds

WHEREAS, the **Calhoun Area Metropolitan Planning Organization** (MPO) is the organization designated by the Governor of the State of Alabama as being responsible, together with the State of Alabama, for implementing the applicable provisions of 23 USC 134 and 135 (amended by the FAST Act, Sections 1201 and 1202, December 2015); 42 USC 2000d-1, 7401; 23 CFR 450 and 500; 40 CFR 51 and 93; and,

WHEREAS, the US Department of Transportation (USDOT) requires all urbanized areas, as established by the US Bureau of the Census, to do area-wide urban transportation planning, and the designated planning organization to submit a Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) as a condition for meeting the provisions of Title 23 USC 134; and,

WHEREAS, consistent with the declaration of these provisions, the East Alabama Regional Planning and Development Commission, as staff to the MPO, in cooperation with the Bureau of Transportation Planning and Modal Programs, Alabama Department of Transportation, has prepared a Unified Planning Work Program for Fiscal Year 2023; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to its duties, functions, and responsibilities, the Calhoun Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) proposes to allocate the remaining administrative funds from fiscal year 2022 in the amount of \$347,894 (\$289,912 Federal; \$57,982 local match) into fiscal year 2023 for completion of the ongoing Transit Study in Task 6.2, an Economic Development Supplemental study for the Transit Study in Task 6.3 and in Task 6.1 to set funds aside for future identification and implementation of special studies as well as for larger plans such as the Long Range Transportation Plan; now,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Calhoun Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), that the Fiscal Year 2023 UPWP be amended as indicated above.
