The meeting was called to order at 10:03 a.m. by Chairman Miller Parnell. Chairman Parnell introduced Bob Sims, a potential CAC member.

OLD BUSINESS:

Minutes of the CAC meetings from January 17, 2024, were approved on a motion by Mr. Tim Huddleston and seconded by Mr. Bill Williams. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

Chairman Parnell called for a review of the FY 24-27 TIP Spreadsheet and Administrative Modifications. Ms. Messick explained that one administrative modification created changes to the TIP spreadsheet and no administrative modifications did not create changes to the TIP spreadsheet.

Chairman Parnell then called for a discussion of Resolution No. 862. Ms. Messick explained this resolution was to certify the FY24 ADA Paratransit Implementation Plan Update. She further explained that this is an annual certification, the TAB solicited public comments and the

comment period ended January 9. A motion was made by Mr. Tim Huddleston to approve this certification with **Resolution No. 862**, which was seconded by Mr. Theo Smart. Motion carried.

Chairman Parnel next called for a discussion of relocating the CAC meetings to the extension conference room. The discussion was favorable towards the move. A resolution will be presented at next month's meeting to determine if CAC meetings should be held in this alternate location.

Chairman Parnel next called for a discussion of reducing the number of CAC seats. Ms. Messick explained she could not find the resolutions that added seats the CAC after the 2000 and 2010 Census, but there was nothing in the bylaws that stated they had to remain this number or how they these numbers were delegated. She suggested reducing the number of seats for Anniston and Oxford from 13 to 9 and for Jacksonville from 7 to 6. This would reflect the most current Census as well as reduce the burden on the mayors to find committee members for the CAC. The discussion was favorable. A resolution will be presented at next month's meeting to determine if these seats can be reduced.

Status Report of Pre-Construction projects. Ms. Messick explained the TAC would be reporting on preconstruction projects to keep the MPO updated on how the projects were progressing. She quickly read through the status of each project currently in preconstruction status.

Chairman Parnell next called for discussion of Status Report of ALDOT projects. Ms. Messick reported that the reconfiguration of the intersection at US 78 and Barry St has utility conflicts, and SR21 resurfacing bridge rail retrofit is awaiting pre-construction meeting.

Chairman Parnell continued by calling for discussion of Safety Observations. Ms. Messick explained that there was a list of previous observations in the agenda packet for review. Ms. Messick explained there were two updates. Mr. Branton Cole reported an update at the TAC meeting the previous week for item number 6 in which the City of Anniston has submitted a formal lighting evaluation request to ALDOT and Mr. Mark Smith reported the City of Jacksonville will submit a request to have a warrant study on item 26. Safety Observation concerns were brought forth including repaving Old Jacksonville Highway, light timing at the 431-Saks intersection, and similar design at 202 intersections at Bynum Leatherwood and Bynum Blvd. These will be added to the Safety Observation list.

OTHER BUSINESS:

Chairman Parnell called for a discussion of CAC vacancies. Anniston has 9 vacancies, Jacksonville has 2, and Oxford has 8 vacancies.

Next, Chairman Parnell called for the report on Urban Fixed Route and ADA Handicapped Transit Systems. Ms. Messick reported the ADA Paratransit Ridership for Anniston had 382 (decrease) one-way trips, Jacksonville had 144 (increase) one-way trips, 22 trips for Weaver (increase), and Oxford had 70 (decrease) one-way trips. For the Urbanized area 71 (decrease) one-way trips and 42 (increase) one-way trips for the Rural area. Fixed-route ridership had a total of 6,047 (increase) riders for the month of December.

The next CAC meeting was scheduled for Wednesday, March 20 at 10:00 a.m.

There being no further business, a motion was made by Mr. Theo Smart to adjourn which was seconded by Dr. David West. The meeting was adjourned at 10:58 a.m.

Adopting the Revision to the Policy, Procedure, and Bylaw Manual for the Calhoun Area Transportation Study

WHEREAS, the Calhoun Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is the organization designated by the Governor of the State of Alabama as being responsible, together with the State of Alabama, for implementing the applicable provisions of amended 23 USC 134 and 135 (SAFETEA-LU Section 6001 August 2005); 42 USC 2000d-1, 7401; 23 CFR 450 and 500; 40 CFR 51 and 93; and

WHEREAS, the existing Policy, Procedure, and Bylaw Manual for the Calhoun Area Transportation Study was updated by Resolution 843 on January 19, 2023

WHEREAS, the Citizen's Advisory Committee proposes to reduce the number of available seats for the municipalities of Anniston, Oxford, and Jacksonville to reflect reduced population numbers from the 2020 Census and reduce the burden of filling current vacant seats
